TVA: THE WAR DEPARTMENT'S WWII SECRET WEAPON

TVA's total involvement in WWII was very extensive but is seldom recognized for its many contributions. However, TVA's call to duty to defend the United States in WWII was loud and strong. Originally tasked with producing fertilizer under the TVA Act, their focus shifted to building dams to provide the massive amount of hydro power needed to support plants producing aluminum for aircraft and ships.

TVA also produced tons of nitrate and phosphorus for military munitions, as well as an intermediate chemical used in sarin nerve agent. TVA's impact on the U.S. war efforts was such that Charles E. Cabler, a U.S. Air Force veteran knew the story was one that needed to be told.

Mr. Cabler drew upon numerous government reports, published articles, library archives, interviews, and personal letters with individuals and organizations to bring to life TVA's pivotal role in the war. His book is a consolidated snapshot of many WWII projects undertaken by dedicated TVA employees.

It contains details which are not generally known, highlighting TVA's significant impact on the war. TVA was truly the war department's "Secret Weapon"!

The Times Daily will feature an article regarding Mr. Cabler and his book on November 9th as part of their Veterans Day tribute.
